

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What is the purpose of the David T. Peet Adult Scholarship Program?

A: Named for CAHEC's former president, the purpose of the program is to provide financial assistance to adult students seeking an education that will increase their gross income earning potential.

Q: Who can receive a Scholarship?

A: All residents of CAHEC-financed developments who are in good standing and are at least 18 years of age are eligible to participate.

Q: What are the scholarship award amounts?

A: CAHEC awards scholarships of up to \$1,000 per year for students attending any accredited community college, trade school, or vocational training school. Scholarships of up to \$2,000 per year may be awarded to students attending any accredited four-year college or university.

Q: What are the terms of the scholarship?

A: Scholarships are good for one year following the award date. Recipients must maintain a minimum 2.75 grade point average to in order to maintain scholarship status.

Q: What expenses does a scholarship cover?

A: Scholarships cover expenses including tuition and fees, and books and supplies required by the course syllabus. The following expenses are not covered by a Scholarship: transportation, admissions/application fees, and books and supplies not covered by the course syllabus.

Q: If I already received or have applied for a Pell Grant, can I still receive a scholarship?

A: Yes!

Q: How do I apply for a scholarship?

Q: Can the scholarship be renewed for future years?

A: Yes, residents are eligible to participate in this program for up to four (4) years. Annual renewals are based on the student's academic success and CAHEC's availability of funds. A renewal application is required each time the participant wishes to request additional funds.
