Dogwood Health Trust is a Community Foundation established for the purpose of dramatically improving the health and wellbeing of all people and communities of Western North Carolina.




Network Lead: Impact Health

Through NC's 1115 waiver, CMS authorized up to \$650 million in Medicaid funding to test evidencebased, non-medical interventions designed to improve health outcomes and reduce healthcare costs for a subset of Medicaid managed care members.

Pilot funds will be used to:

- Cover the cost of federally-approved Pilot services
- Support capacity building to establish "Healthy Opportunities Networks" and strengthen the ability of human service organizations (HSOs) to deliver Pilot services



Healthy Opportunities Pilots: How Do They Work?



Key Entities' Roles in the Pilot

Prepaid Health Plans:

- Approve which enrollees qualify for Pilot services and which services they qualify for
- Manage a Pilot budget and pay HSOs for delivery of Pilot services

Care Managers:

 Interact directly with members to: assess for eligibility and needed services, refer to an HSO, manage coordination of Pilot services and track enrollee progress over time


Network Leads:

- Develop and oversee a network of HSOs and provide ongoing technical assistance/support to HSO network
- Receive, track and validate invoices from HSOs and work with PHP to ensure payment

Human Service Organizations:

- Deliver Pilot services, submit invoices and receive reimbursement for services delivered
- Support identification of potential Pilot-enrollees by connecting them to their PHP or Care Manager

Services and Eligibility

Not all Medicaid enrollees will be eligible for the Healthy Opportunities Pilots.

To qualify for pilot services, Medicaid managed care enrollees in Standard Plans and Behavioral Health Tailored Plans must live in a Pilot Region - Tribal Plan and Foster Care (12/23):



At least one Physical/Behavioral Health Criteria:

(varies by population, examples below)

- Adults 2 or more qualifying chronic
- Pregnant Women history or poor birth outcomes
- Children, ages 0-3 neonatal intensive care graduate
- Children, ages 0-20 has 3 or more adverse childhood experiences



At least one Social Risk Factor:

- Homeless and/or housing insecure
- Food insecure
- Transportation insecure
- At risk of, witnessing or experiencing interpersonal violence

What are the Services Offered?

NC DHHS has defined and priced 29 services that can be covered by the Pilot. These services will be reimbursed via fee-for-service (FFS), per-member per-month (PMPM) payments, or cost-based reimbursement up to a cap and include:



Housing

- Housing navigation, support and sustaining services
- Inspection for housing safety and quality
- · Housing move-in support
- · Essential utility set-up
- · Home remediation services
- Home accessibility and safety modifications
- · Healthy home goods
- One-time payment for security deposit and first month's rent
- Short-term post hospitalization housing



Food

- Food and nutrition access case management
- Evidence-based group nutrition class
- Diabetes Prevention Program
- Fruit and vegetable prescription
- Healthy food box (pick-up or delivered)
- Healthy meal (pick-up or delivered)
- Medically Tailored Home Delivered Meal



Transportation

- Reimbursement for health-related public or private transportation
- Transportation case management



Interpersonal Safety

- Interpersonal safety case management
- Violence intervention services
- Evidence-based parenting curriculum
- Home visiting services
- Dyadic therapy



Cross-Domain

- Holistic highintensity enhanced case management
- Medical respite
- Linkages to healthrelated legal supports










HOP Referrals by Domain
